Treasurer's Report

Income: 4 members renewed, 3 calendar sales.

Balance about \$4,000.

Committee looking over income and expenses for the conference, did not lose money. Bill asked for a round of applause for everyone that went and those that helped organize.

Observing Notes

- Bill said that after that Saturday night, there were lots of hands, he sketched out The Sobrero Galaxy in 104, 4 Messier objects. 6'1/4" achromatic lens. MikeCurrie took a look through "Big Red" as well.
- After Mike Currie had asked how the public was, Josef mentioned trying to organize something every
 month, but Mike could not go Friday. Saturady, thanks to Jeff Newland for showing up, but there was bad
 weather, no one showed up.
- Bob Fealey mentioned Glory Dei Church parking lot observing event. Jeff and Randy were there. The sky was good enough to see Jupiter and the spot. A neighborhood lady on a walk asked "what are you doing" ... called her 14-year old son, Nick, who would be excited to join in. He had a Dob just like Jeff's. Rady and Jeff helped him collimate his scope. Soon after, Nick was showing other guests his scope, clearly a talented youngster with a keen interest in science (solar astrophysics in particular). Dr. Roger Harms (donated "Elvis" to the club) and his wife were there as well. Jeff mentioned that the moon was also very good, four scopes with Nick's there.
- Dean mentioned a shadow transition of Jupiter Friday night. Saturday was M51, M81, M82, M101, M108, M9, ... in Virgo, Leo's triplet, M107, The Flower, NGC 3242 (Ghost of Jupiter), Ring Nebula, NGC 6543 (Cat's Eye), M5, M13, NGC 6207, M92, M4, open cluster M35, NGC 2538, NGC 9657, Double Cluster, M1 (supernova remnant), and then Saturn finished off the night. There was also a comet, which Mike asked about. Mike Currie had stumbled on "Jupiter's Ghost" and had to ask Dean what he was looking at. Dean indicated it is north of M83 (NGC 3242).
- Luka mentioned that he was checking out a lot of things in binoculars with Jerome, 80% of which were open clusters that Dean noted. Mike said they were HD Quality, 70 mm Oberwerks. Ring Nebula distinct at 20x, not so at 15x. M101 & M51 (not seen in binocs in a long time). Dean mentioned Epsilon Lyra as well.
- There were also some drone photos (at the conference) that Bill mentioned being via Mike Currie's drone. No one apparently got a count of the number of scopes present. Luka said it was nice to observe with Duane Deal again. (drone pic from 8:31 p.m. Saturday night shown)
- Kirk mentioned that during the second night there was some playing around with the club's Explore Scientific telescope, searching for the comet.

News

- NCRAL 2017 During the observing notes, Dean had asked about how many attendees there were, Julie
 indicated there were 63 paid, along with 8 speakers. Bill said that he had a picture of Mike getting a picture
 of the group. Pictures from the conference were shown. There was an mp4 from Mike that Bill could not get
 to work, possibly have pointers to it in the newsletter. Dean pointed out that next year's conference is May
 14th.

- Dean mentioned public observing through 40-inch telescope (largest refractor) in Williams Bay, Wisconsin.
